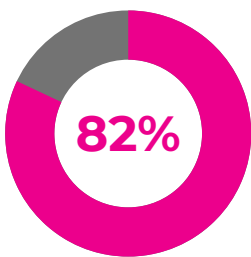
About Teach Beyond Text

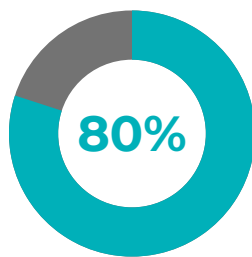

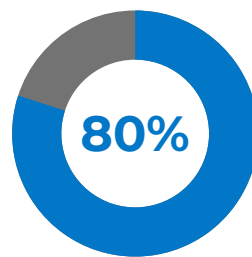

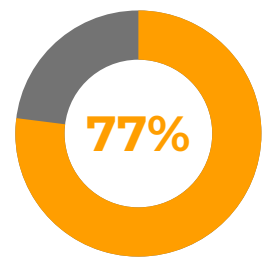

Why inclusive pedagogy matters

1 Learners are more diverse than ever

Over 20% of students in UK higher and further education identify as having a disability, learning difference or mental health condition. Many of these learners process information more effectively through sound, visuals and discussion than through text alone.

2 Teaching approaches are evolving

Traditional teaching methods are struggling to meet the needs of today's learners. Film, TV and radio help make learning more accessible and engaging by presenting ideas in multiple formats and supporting diverse communication and cognitive needs.

3 Film, TV and radio improve learning

Research shows that combining text, image and sound can improve comprehension, motivation and recall. Used purposefully, audiovisual media helps bring complex ideas to life, deepen engagement and make learning more accessible for diverse student cohorts.

4 Inclusion is now a professional expectation
